

Parcel F Groundbreaking

The pile driving program at Parcel F, a 23-story multi-family residential tower, recently completed and construction continues with excavation. Designed by architects Studio Gang and Quezada Architecture, Parcel F will encompass 254 rental apartments, a series of amenity and outdoor spaces, a variety of street-level shops and cafes, as well as coworking space. Parcel F is the fourth and final tower in the first phase of the development.

China Basin Park Celebration

The team recently broke ground at China Basin Park, and we celebrated this momentous occasion to recognize community visionaries who have helped shape the park vision along the waterfront. China Basin Park will be a public five-acre waterfront park and was designed by architects SCAPE, Miller Company Landscape Architects, and Min Design. The park will open sequentially as different aspects of the park are completed over a multiyear period.
